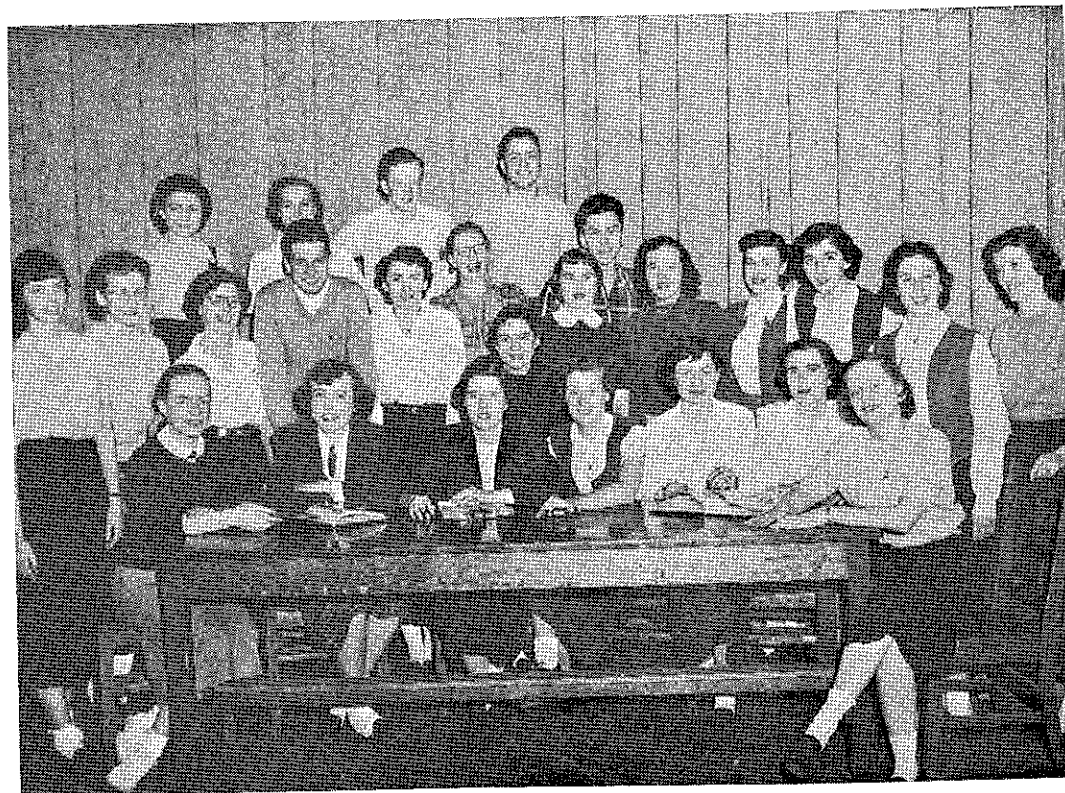

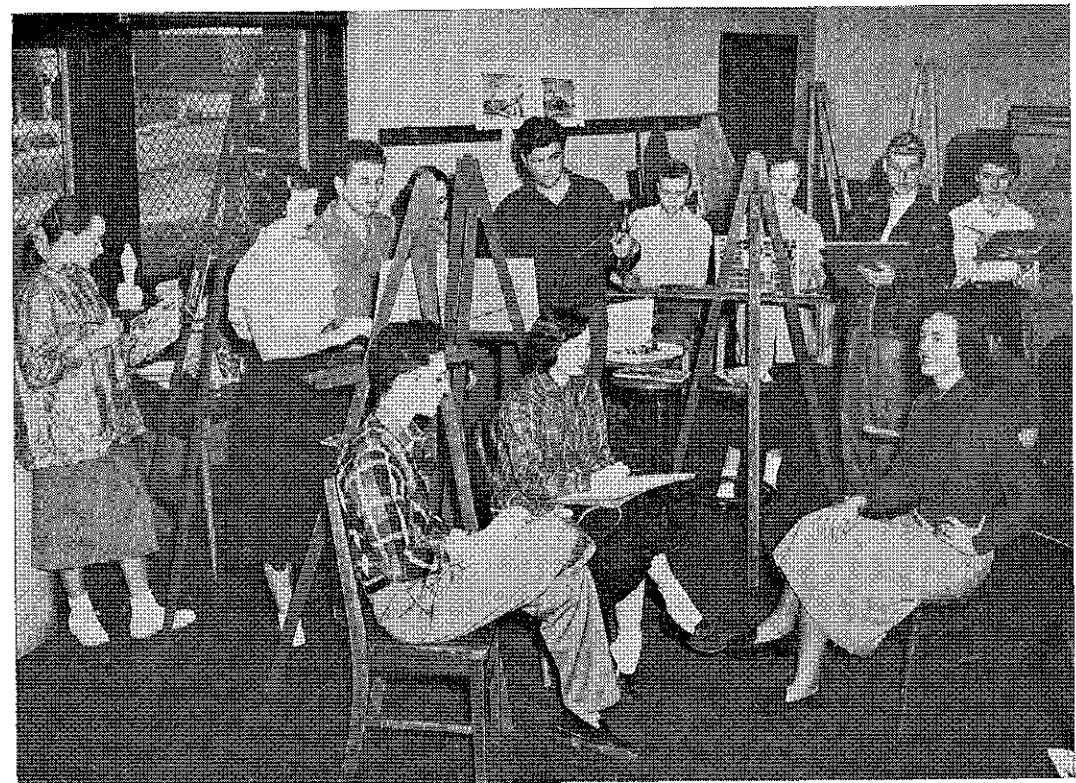

Membership in the club is open to students who are in their second year of college Spanish, and to students in the first year classes after the completion of the first semester.

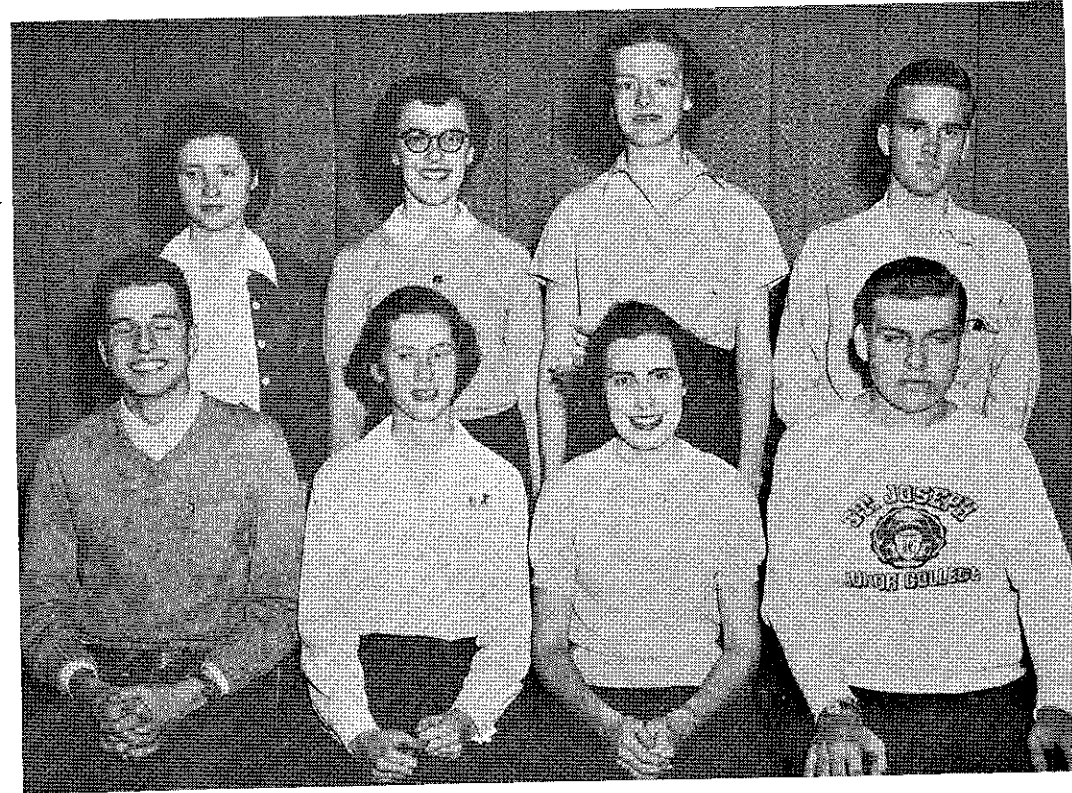
