



"In accordance with the increasing demand on the part of the young people and the parents in the vicinity of St. Joseph for education at home beyond the high school, the Board of Education of the city established a Junior College Course in 1915, as a new and distinctive feature of the public school system of St. Joseph

public school system of St. Joseph.

This is the fortieth year of existence and is a proper place in J. C. history to stop, look back and take stock of all that has been established and accomplished. Too often we tend to take for granted all the opportunities that we have, and do not appreciate their real significance. Junior College had its first home in several crowded classrooms in Central High School, then it was moved to the small Everett grade school building, and, finally, to its present location. Today's Junior College has progressed from the original thirteen classes under eight subjects to eighty-six classes under twenty-one subjects; from ten instructors to twenty;


from a tuition of twenty dollars per semester for residents and thirty dollars for non-residents, to no tuition fee for residents and seventy-five dollars for non-residents; and from one associate degree of an Associate in Arts, to an offer of an Associate in Education, Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, or a Junior College Certificate. Veterans now can enroll without question, while in the past arrangements had to be made for students of mature years.

St. Joseph Junior College has progressed a long way and, as a rare, priceless ruby, has been the light which has guided many in the past forty years to knowledge and truth and will continue to do so long into the future.

#### DEDICATION






Delta Psi Omega






