




















#### Queen Taira Young Reigns Over Homecoming Activitie












#### **Psychology Club Sponsors Two Speakers**




## Art Takes Shape

During intermission, newly elected SGA officers Mike Cazel and Bill Walker were sworn in by past president Rusty Hurst.











## M. V. Harvey Lecture Series


## Speakers Help Education in Departmental Areas




#### **Individual Records Set**


Griffon runners produced a total of 215 runs for Western this past season. The Griffs also stole a total of 36 bases, 7 of them going to Ralph Sauceda.







## Various Events Covered by Intramurals

**MWC Golfers Capture NAIA Title** 










### **Provide Various Activities and Exercise**
