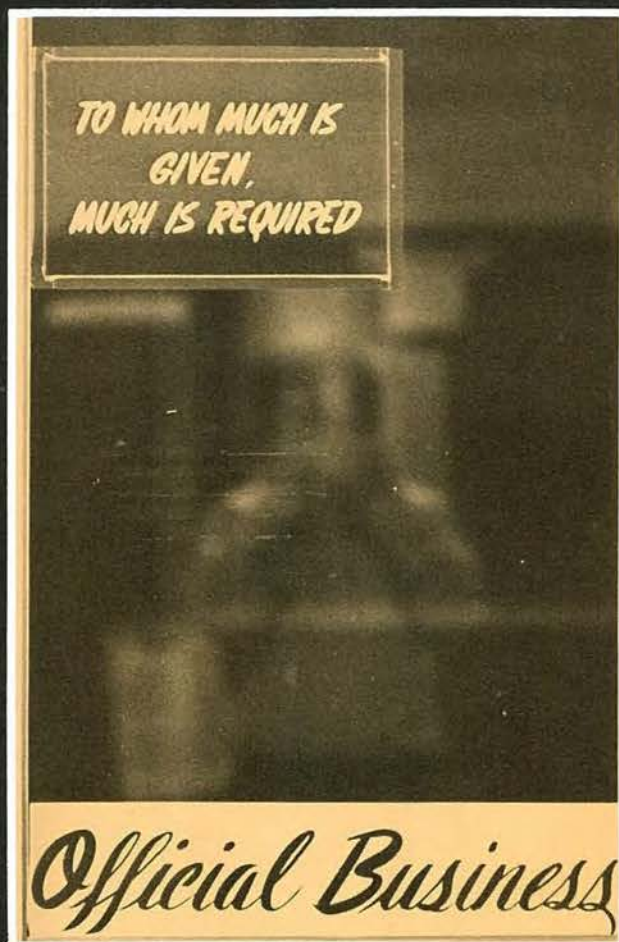


Stop, Look, Listen

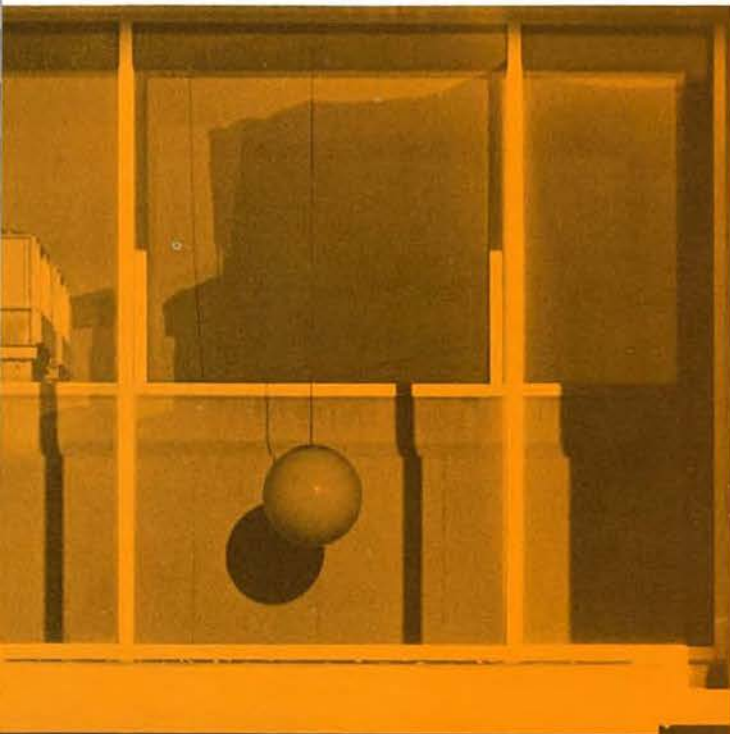


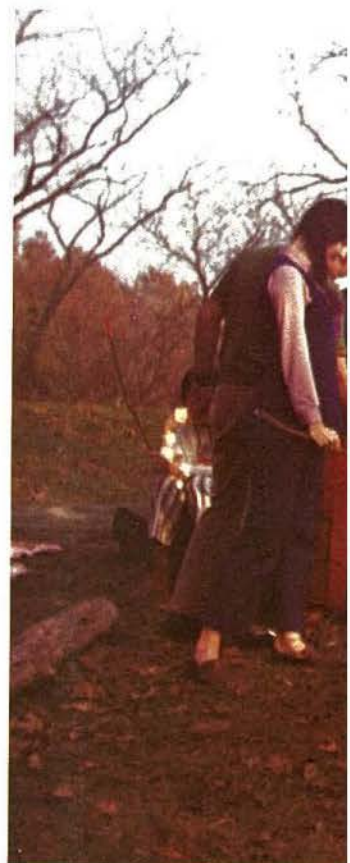


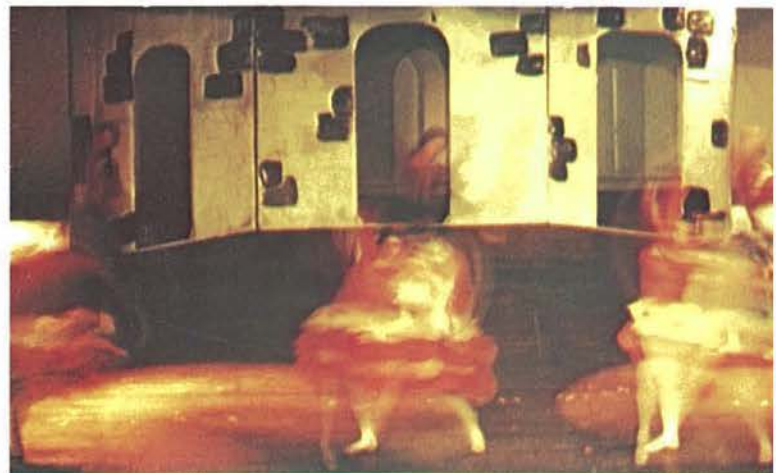
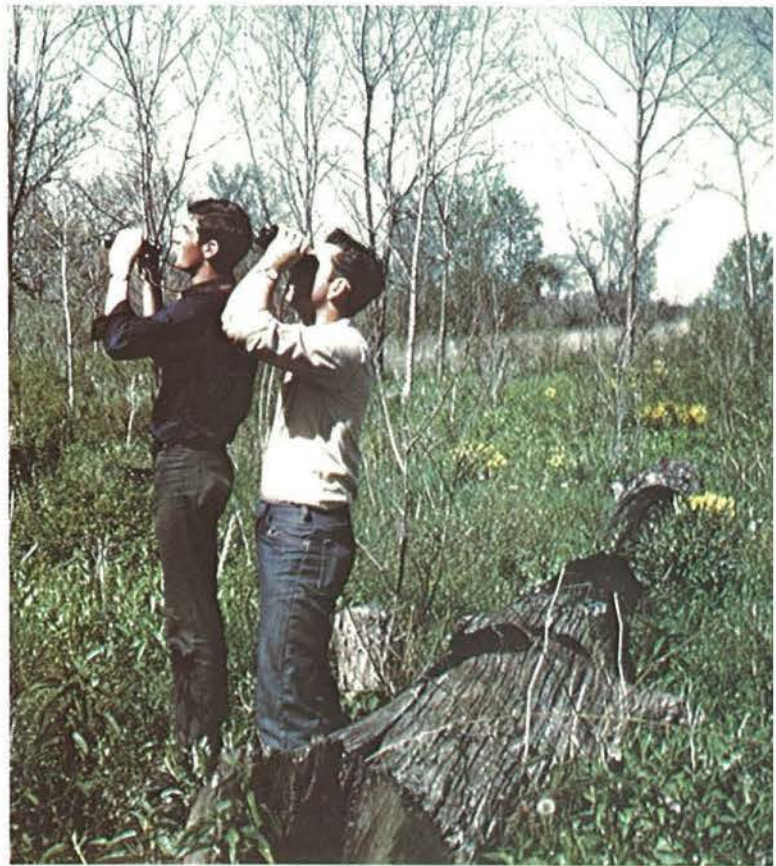


Way of Life

Around campus, life goes on with the three modes of transportation pictured. Night life, snow blizzards, and summer scenes are all the way of life at MWC.



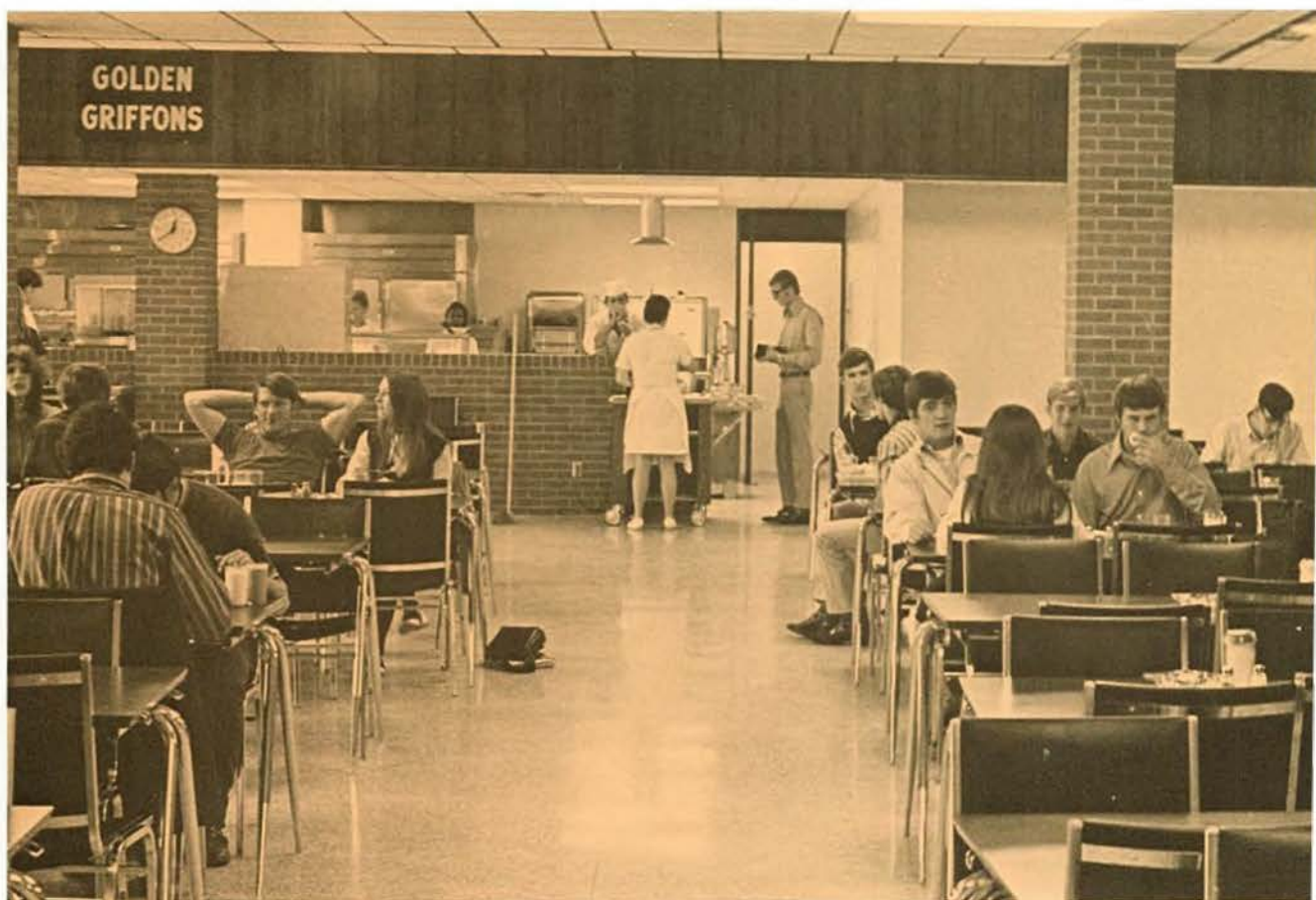


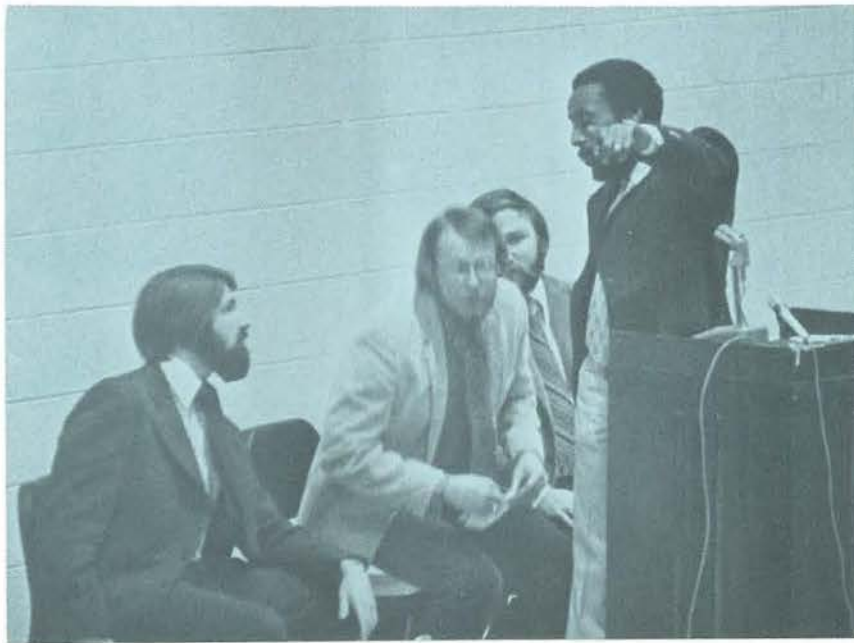


Carry on Campus

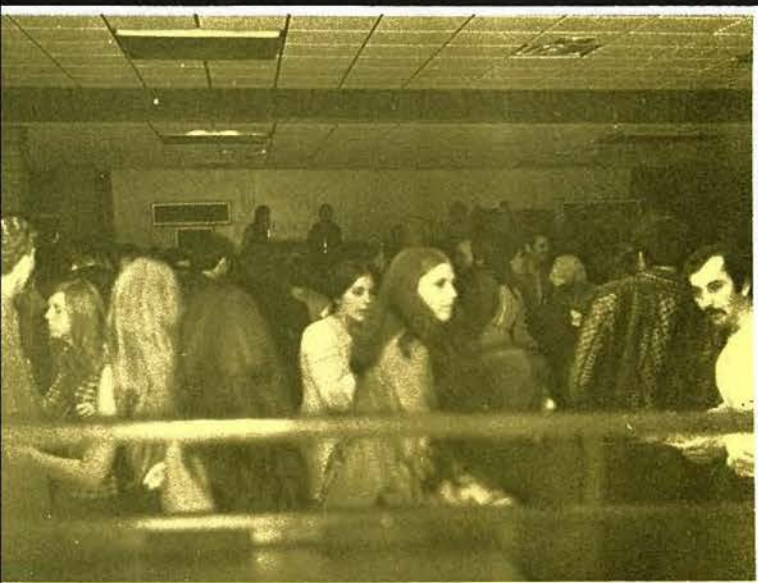

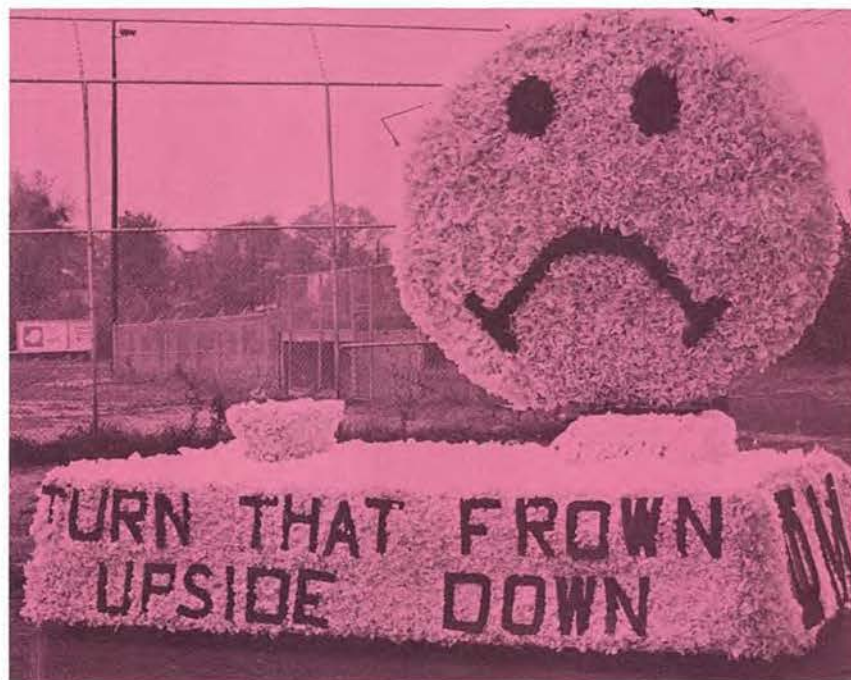




Computer Science Club Sweeps Three Homecoming Honors

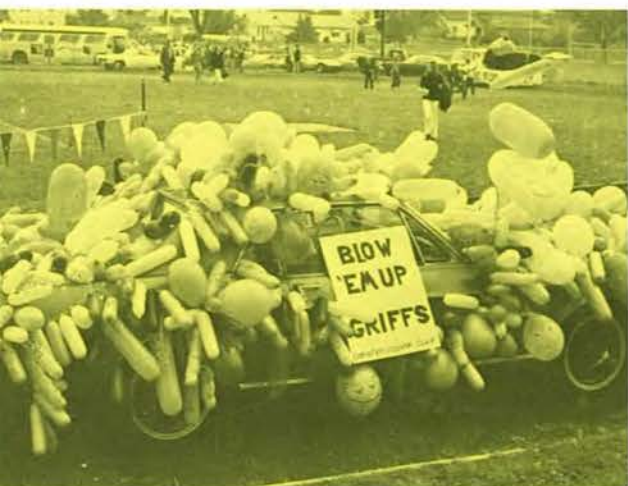

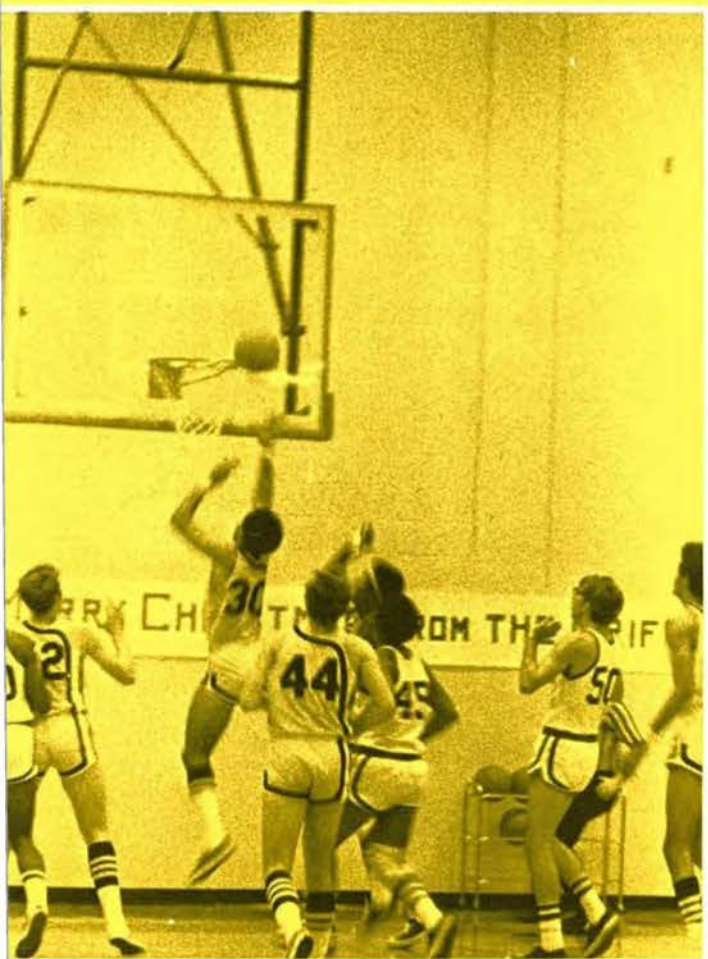


Hillyard Christmas Classic Sets Stage for

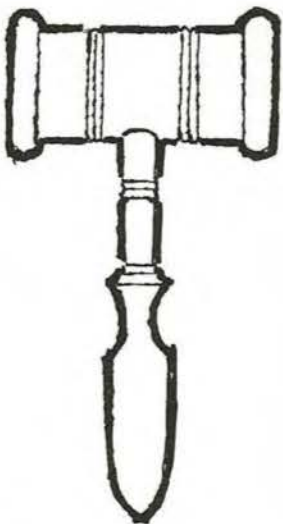
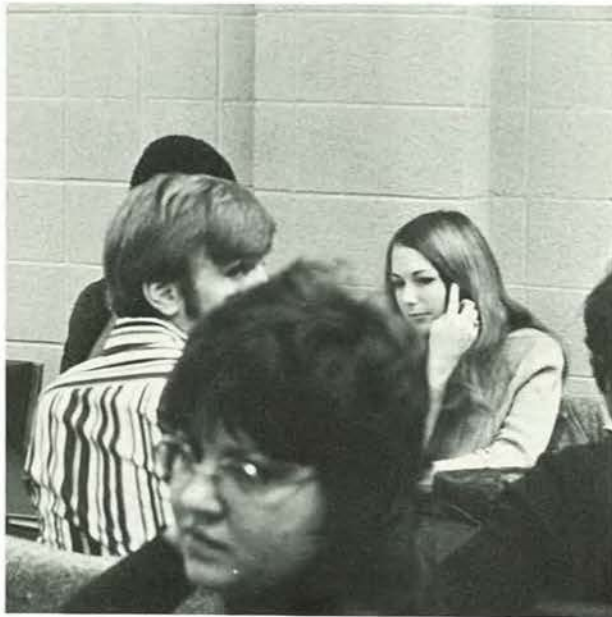
PARTICIPATION

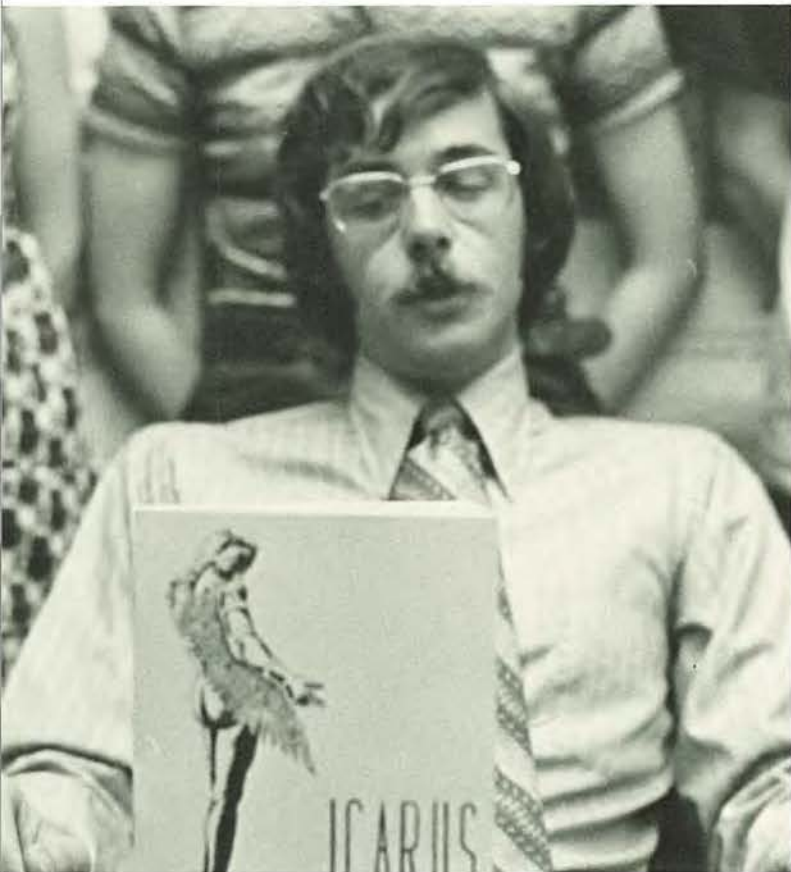

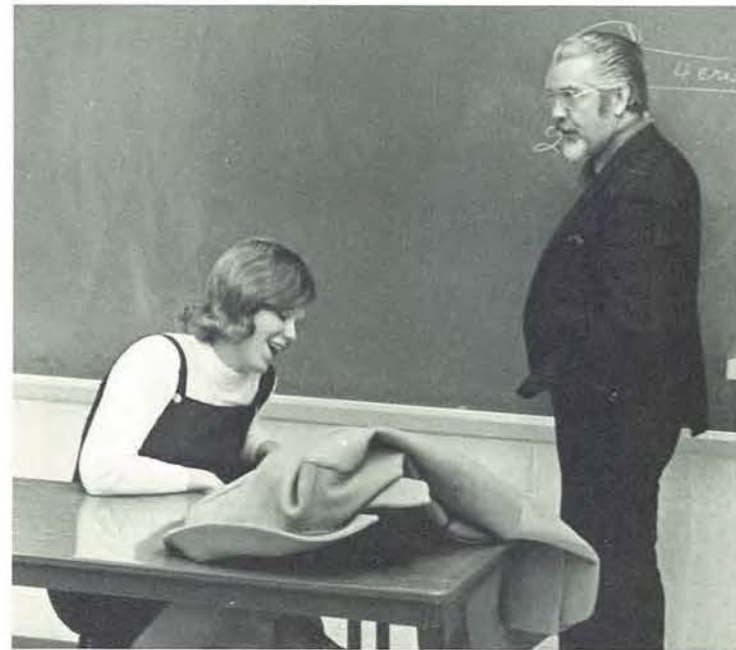

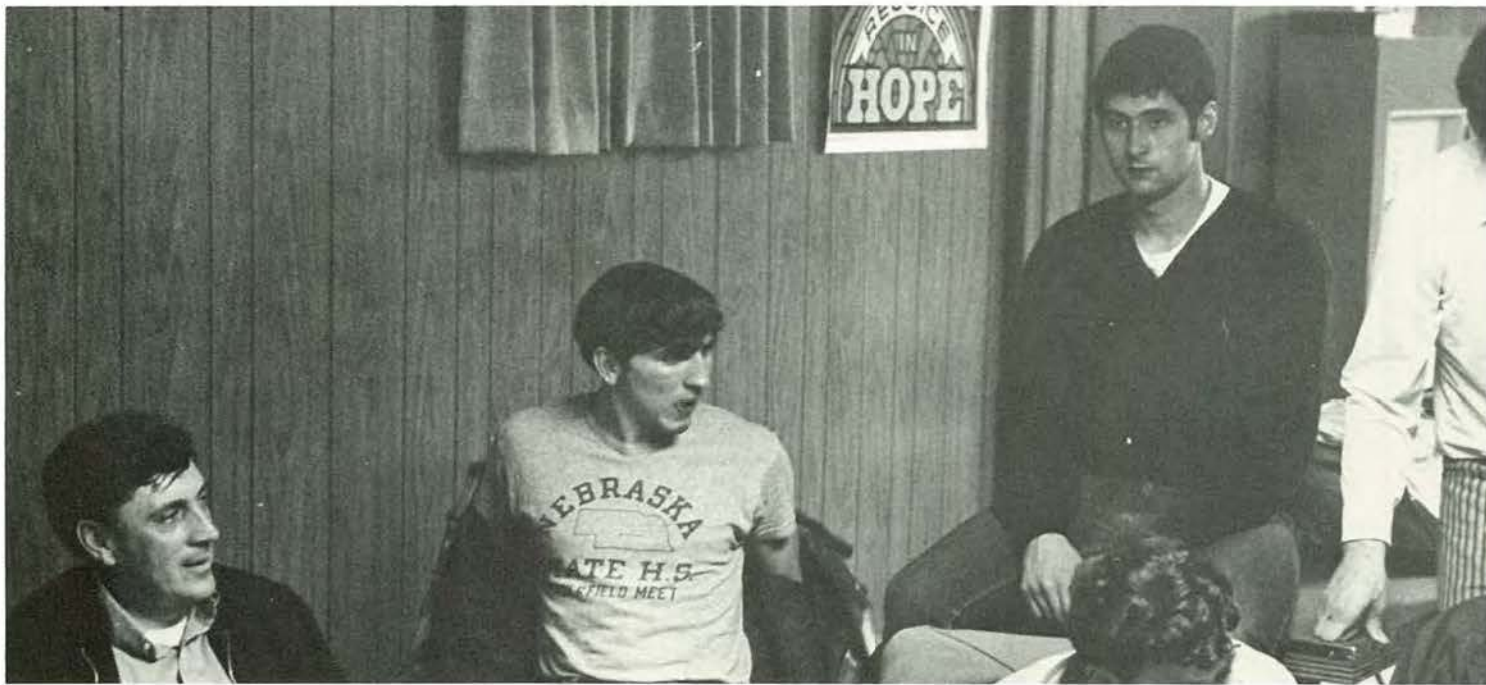


Journey Inn

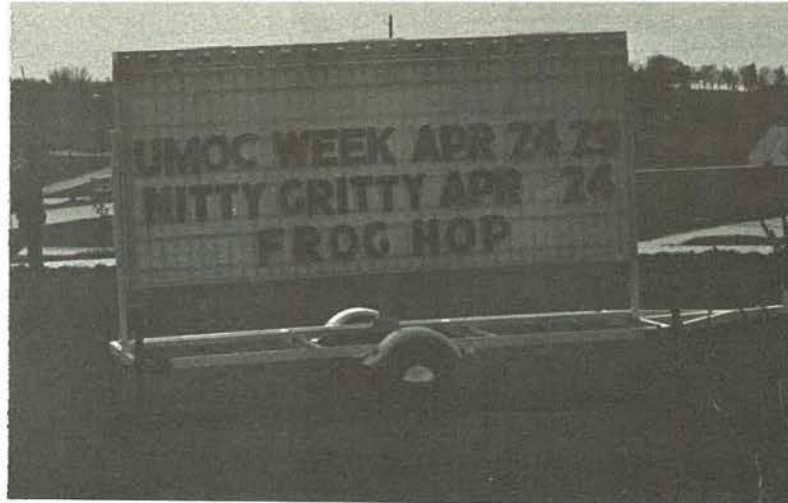


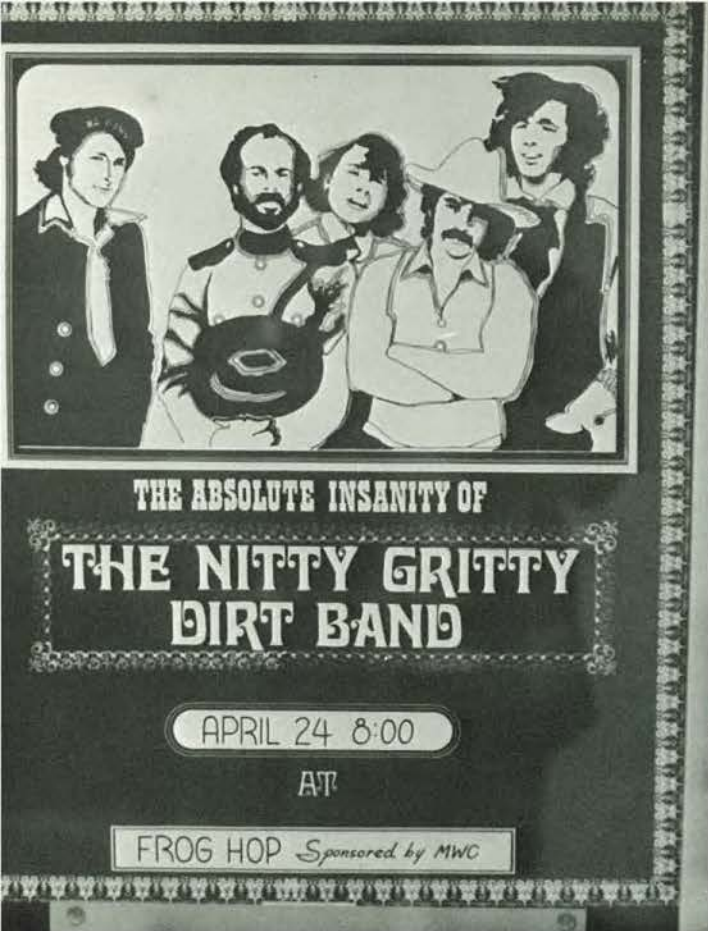
Blood on Tap!

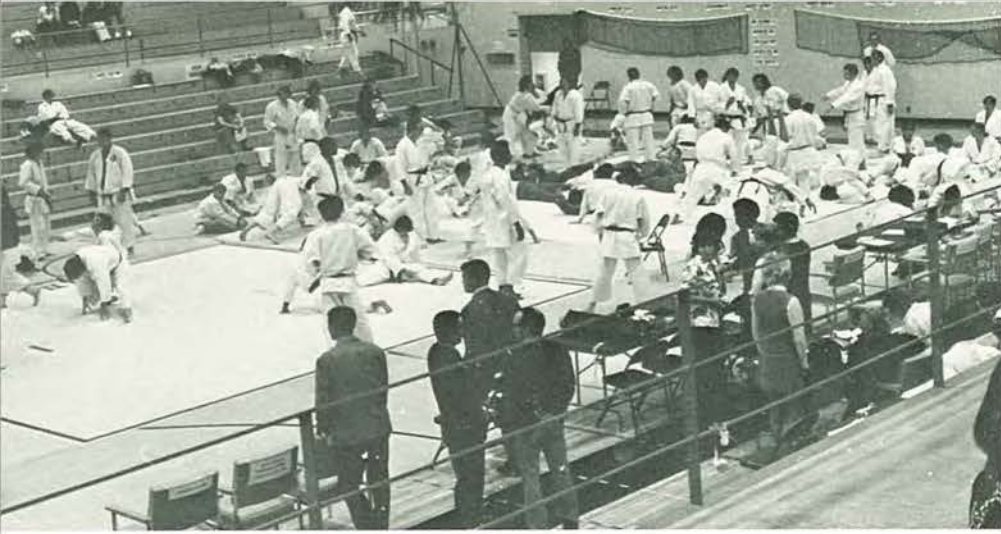
During intermission, newly elected SGA officers Mike Cazel and Bill Walker were sworn in by past president Rusty Hurst.

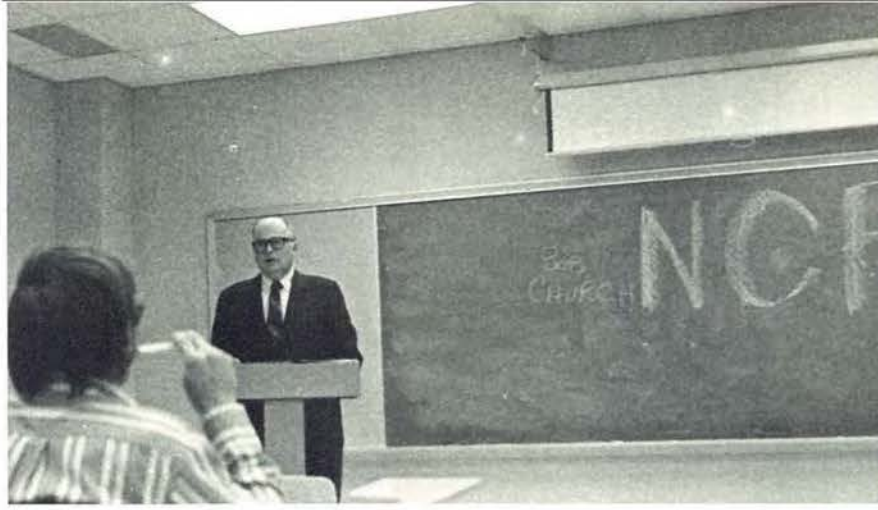


M. V. Harvey Lecture Series

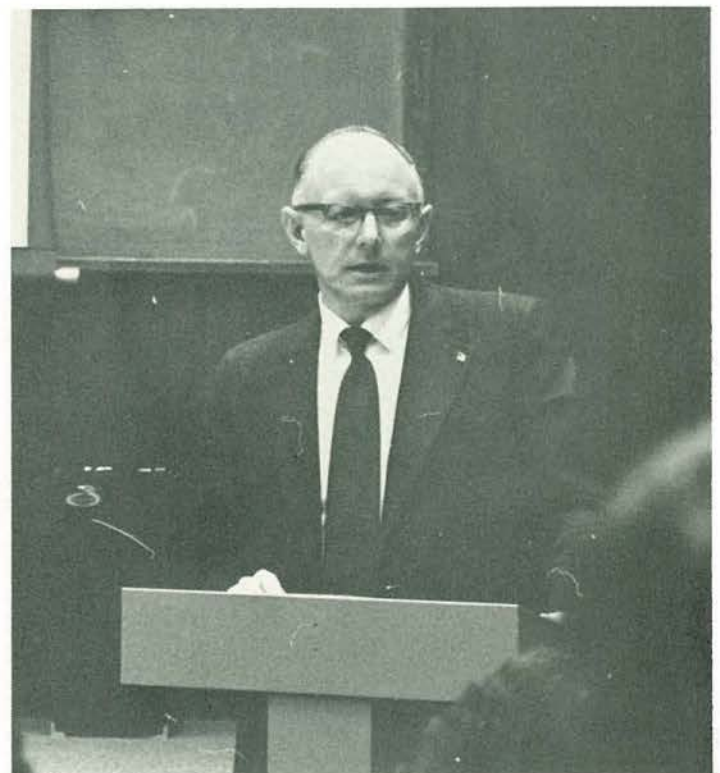

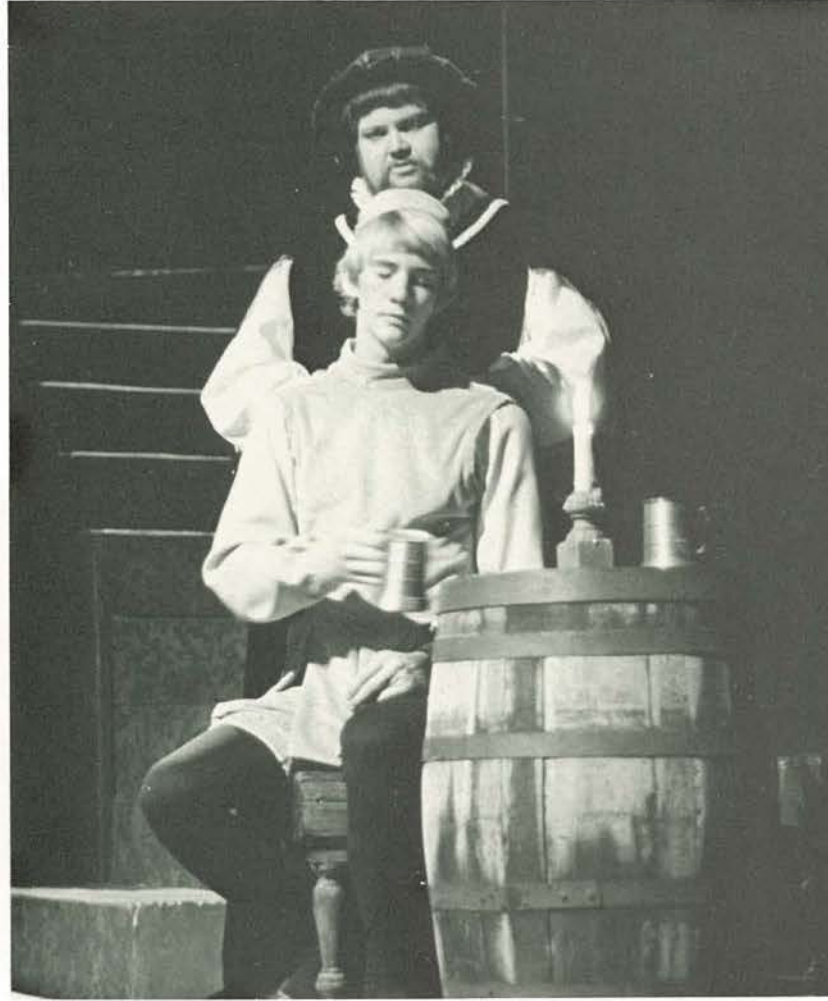


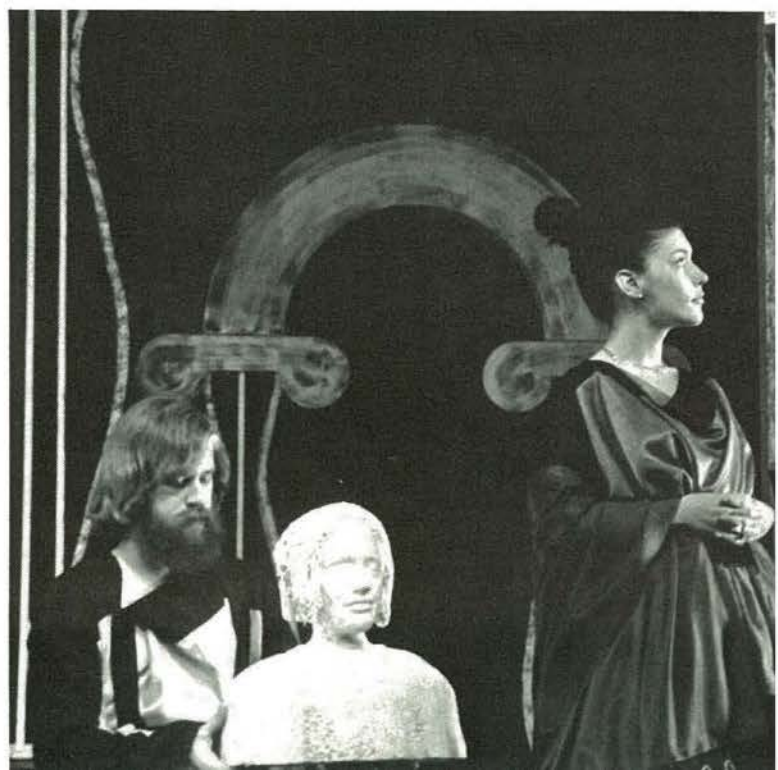
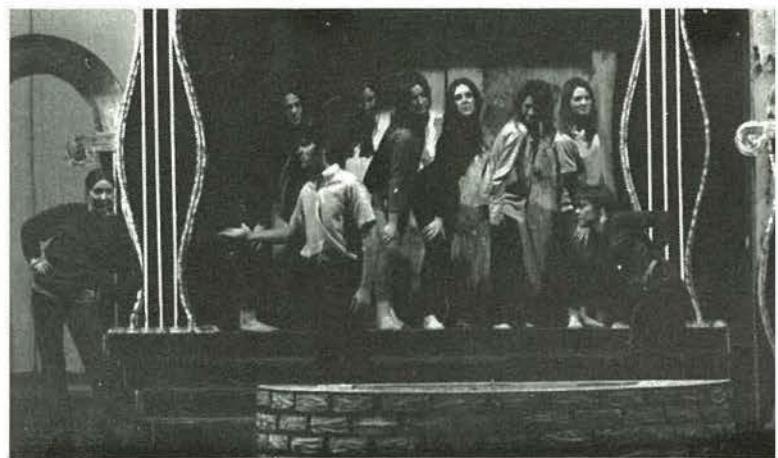
A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS

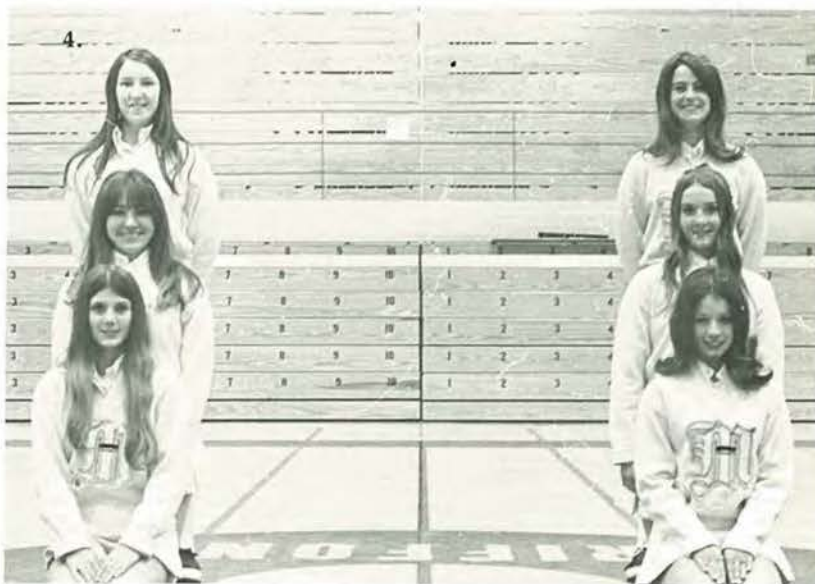

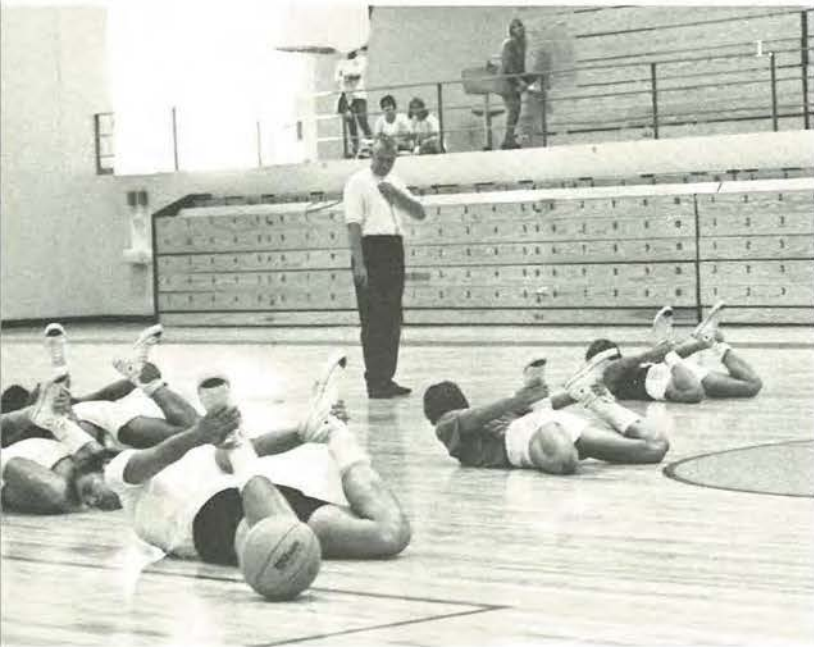
With Two Consecutive Wins

A fantastic ball-handling whiz from Savannah, Georgia, Larry (Gator) Rivers, who is known for his quickness and ability on a basketball court, earned his starting position on the Griff squad. Larry also set two individual records in a game against Southwest Baptist. He scored a total high of 32 points, and made 15 field goals. Walter Hughes attained the individual record high of 10 free throws out of 13 attempts in the game against Mercer U. in Georgia. Mark Browne grabbed the most rebounds per game record in the game with Mid-American Nazarene with 24 rebounds; this game was also a lopsided victory for the Griffs — 135-79.

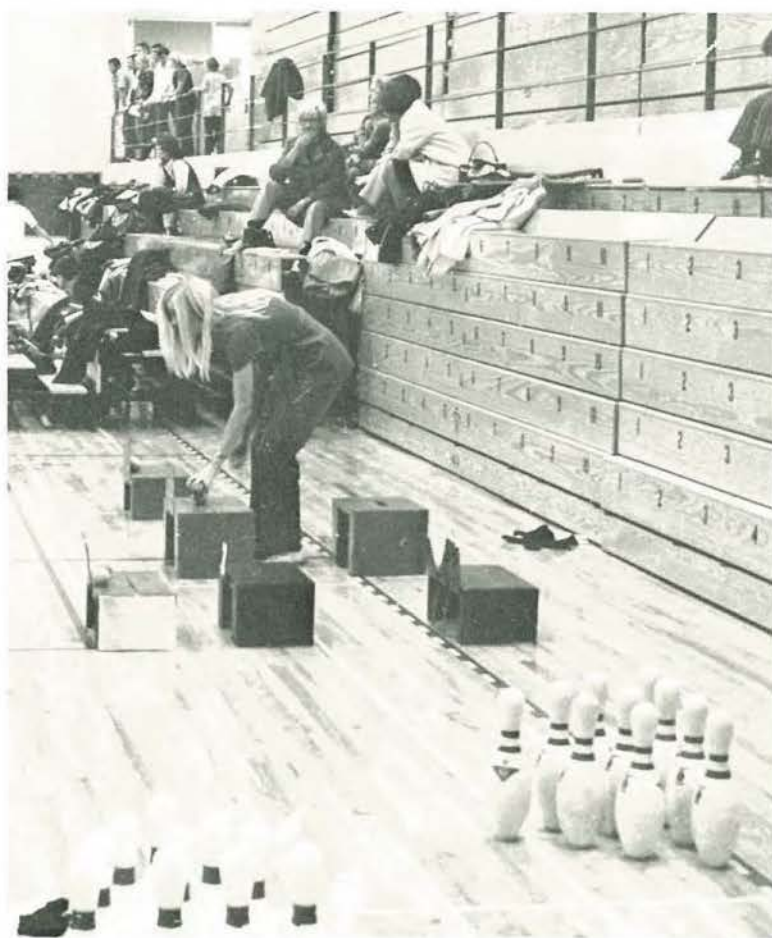
P.E. Workshop a Real Workout

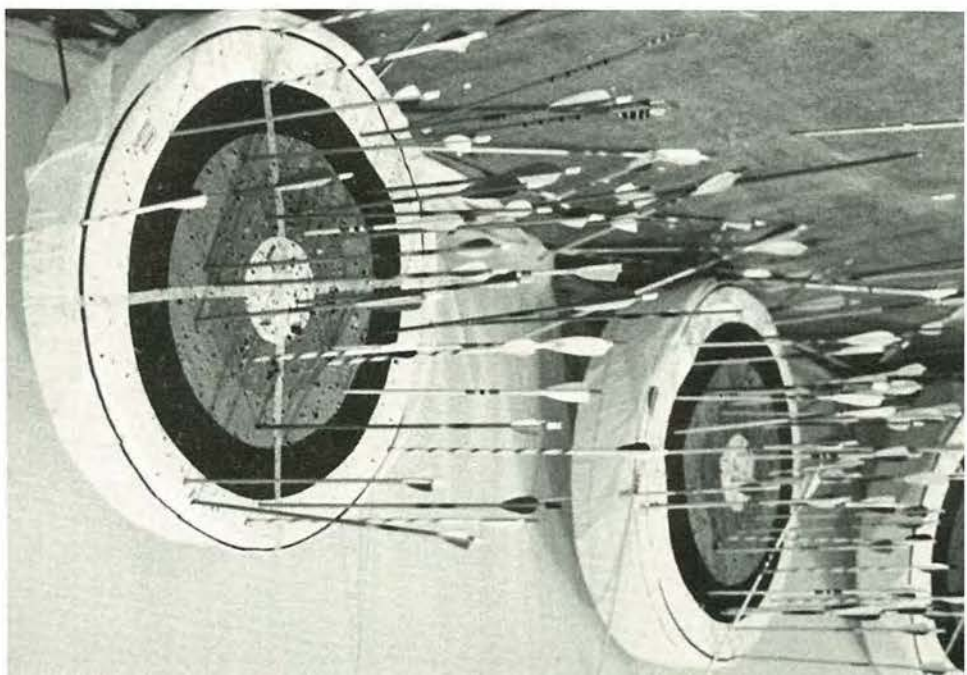
MWC Golfers Capture NAIA Title
